Opening Prayer

Wednesday Prayer Meeting, 06/10/2026

Psalm: 100.1-5; Page 286

First Exhortation: Praying Through John's Gospel, Chapter 10: John 9.1-42

Prayer re: Ministry, Sheep, Understanding, Life, Christ's Sacrifice, Antithesis, Faith, Security, Jesus' Deity and Works

1. Pray for the ministry of the Gospel, for receiving of true under-shepherds, and refusing false shepherds, hirelings, thieves, wolves and robbers; pray that the people of God would not be spoiled of their reward by false shepherds. (John 10.1-13)
2. Pray for professing Christians, that they would follow the voice of Christ alone, would not hear the voice of strangers, would humbly here Him at all times, follow Him into the sheepfold, unto spiritual safety finding true restful pasture. (John 10.4-9)
3. Pray for satisfaction and contentment with the pasture that Christ has chosen for us, leaving off covetousness. (Jn. 10.4)
4. Pray that we would be of those who hear and understand the Word of the Lord, that He would open our understanding to hear Him, that when we read His Word, hear preaching, sing Psalms, that the Lord would open our minds. (John 10.6)
5. Pray that Christians would live and walk in the abundant life that Christ has purchased for them, resisting temptation, doing spiritual exploits, victorious, being constant in prayer, meditation, usefulness in His Kingdom, giving Him glory. (Jn. 10.10)
6. Pray for true knowledge of Christ and His sacrifice, that in Covenant with His Father He laid down His life for sinners, for His sheep, that they might live—though able to deliver Himself, He became obedient to the death of the cross, completely satisfying divine justice on behalf of His sheep, securing eternal life to them. (John 10.15-18)
7. Pray for knowledge and application of the antithesis of knowing Christ; That He is either devil-possessed and mad, or He is the very Eternal Son of God, that there is no middle way; and that we would know Him as God's Son. (Jn. 10.19-21)
8. Pray that we would receive the testimony of the Scriptures regarding Christ, that He is the Eternal God, the Only Begotten Son, that His Person and Works would draw us to Himself, that we would not look for "signs," a "burning in the bosom," but trust Christ as revealed in His Word, hearing His voice as His sheep. (John 10.22-27)
9. Pray that we would rest in the Lord's ability to keep us, that in an ordinary use of the means of grace we might enjoy perseverance, not resting in our works, but in the Father's and Christ's power to keep us alone. (John 10.29-30)
10. Pray that we would not doubt Christ's ability to save, that we would be delivered from temptation to think we are out of the reach of His grace, that Christ was sanctified and sent into this world, as the eternal Son of God, to save sinners, that He receives all who come to Him though they be rebels, and that coming, they are secure in Him. (John 10.31-42)

Second Exhortation: Praying Through Deuteronomy, Chapter 10: Deuteronomy 10.1-22

Prayer re: Law, Renewal, Worship, Assembling, Sojourning, Ministry, Intercession, Love to God, Election, Humility

1. Pray for an understanding of the importance of God's Law among the visible Church, that ministers would teach it, and that it would permeate the rest of our society, even into the civil sphere, that laws would be just. Pray for an end to antinomianism and licentiousness, that we would humbly and faithfully submit ourselves to God's law. (Deut. 10.1-2)
2. Pray concerning renewal, that where the Church has erred, allowed evil, gone astray from the good old paths, that the Lord would renew us, calling us back to His Word and Law, that we might serve Him faithfully. (Deut. 10.1-2)
3. Pray for a renewal of worship, and our reverence for it—that our secret, private, and public worship would be used with spiritual strength and perseverance, that the means of grace would have its due fruit among us. (Deut. 10.1-4)
4. Pray in the assembly of saints, we would be ready to hear the Word of the Lord, that when He speaks, He would be pleased to command our intellect, thoughts, affections, and all our action, conforming it to Himself.
5. Pray for the people of God as we make our way in this earthly sojourn, that we would not love this world, neither the things in the world, that we would remember we are travelers to a heavenly land, that we would maintain heavenly affections, that we would "use things and love God," that we would be satisfied with the "fare" of travelers, keeping our hope and confidence in the Lord and the glorious reward that belongs to His sons and daughters. (Deut. 10.6-7)
6. Pray for the ministers of the Word, that they might be faithful in carrying the "burdens" of the ministry, much in prayer, in study, in encouragement, in correction and counsel, and in all able ministers of the New Covenant. (Deut. 10.8-9)
7. Pray for the ministers, and members of the Church, that they would be much in prayer for one another, interceding for one another before the throne, and let us all be thankful for the intercession of Christ, showing that thankfulness by interceding for one another, that the Lord would grant to us to be able to admonish one another as well. (Deuteronomy 10.10)
8. Pray that the people of God would love the Lord their God more and more, with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength, manifesting the strength and spirituality of that love by humble obedience and devotion to Him. (Deut. 10.16)
9. Pray concerning divine election, that the Church would not become complacent and presumptuous, misusing that precious doctrine, but would humbly draw near to the Lord in confidence of His love to them. (Deut. 10.14-15)
10. Pray that we would with humility follow the Lord in the care of the least among us, that we would love the stranger, the widow, the orphan, in testimony His kindness, being strangers with Him, and He has brought us near. (Deut. 10.18-22)
