## Opening Prayer

## First Exhortation: Praying Through John's Gospel, Chapter 11: John 11.1-57

**Prayer re: Illness, Reliance, Death, Light, Communion, Resurrection, Curse, Intercession, Life, Unbelief, Substitute**

1. Pray that Christians would not fear sickness, but that all our illnesses would be sanctified by the Lord to us, to do our souls good, that we might call upon Him in them, resting in His sending even of affliction, for His glory. (Jn. 11.1-3)
2. Pray that in every circumstance we might encourage one another to rest upon the Lord, going to Him with our troubles, seeking His deliverance and care, with confidence in His mercy, looking to glorify Him. (John 1.3-4)
3. Pray that all men would consider their mortality, that it is the wages of sin, that we might live as those who will give account at the end of days, that our lives are but a vapor, that we would call upon the Lord. (John 11.12-16)
4. Pray for diligence in walking every day, that we might "walk in the day" knowing how we ought to live before the Lord, before the world, conscientiously, diligent in our service to Christ. (John 11.9-10)
5. Pray that the people of God would be fearless in their communion with Christ, following Him even when hazardous, with courage always serving Him from the heart, steadfast in testimony to His Name. (John 11.7-16)
6. Pray for sturdy teaching concerning the resurrection of the dead, that all will give account before the Lord, and that all who are Christ's might have a confident hope of their future glory with Christ forever, that such a hope would encourage us today to live after Him who is the resurrection and the life, unbound from the fear of death. (John 11.21-27)
7. Pray that following our Lord's example we would grieve rightly concerning the course and its sad effects, that we would enter into the sufferings of others, that we would not rejoice in the misery of others, but comfort instead. (John 11.33-38)
8. Pray that concerning Christ and His mediation, we would have confidence that the Father always hears the Son, that as Christ intercedes for us, He is heard, and we are blessed and protected. Pray also that many would know the danger they are in being apart from the mediation of Christ, that they might flee to Him. (John 11.39-44)
9. Pray that many of the dead in sins would hear the voice of the Son of God and come out, hearing Him. (Jn. 11.43-44)
10. Pray for evil officers in the Church who yet are unbelievers, that they would turn to Christ, or be deposed. (John 11.47-57)
11. Pray that Christ would be known as more than a good and kind teacher, that He would be recognized as the Surety and Substitute, the lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, especially His sheep. (John 11.51-52)

## Second Exhortation: Praying Through Deuteronomy, Chapter 11: Deuteronomy 11.1-32

**Prayer re: Love to God, Duty, Mighty Acts, Strength, Inheritance, Providence, Memory, Victory, Blessing, Cursing**

1. Pray that the people of God would have a sound love for God, not base emotion, but obedient affection toward Him, and all His judgments, statutes, and commands, serving Him joyfully according to their places. (Deut. 11.1)
2. Pray that Christians would take responsibility in hearing the Word, that they would not off-load their duty to others, neither feign ignorance, but with love toward the Lord would embrace their duty to serve Him. (Deut. 11.2-7)
3. Pray that the Lord's people, reading of the mighty acts of the Lord, would take comfort, beholding His mercy, applying that to themselves, receiving His favorable acts of deliverance or His chastisements all with faith and love to Him. (Dt. 11.2-7)
4. Pray for the recognition by God's people that their strength is found in obedience, that in hearing the voice of the Lord and doing all He commands as a people, is great spiritual strength, by which He advances His kingdom. (Deut. 11.8-9)
5. Pray that we might know our inheritance in the Lord, as joint-heirs with Christ, knowing His mighty triumph on our behalf, that we would not love this world, but as sojourners keep our eyes fixed on heaven and His reward there. (Dt. 11.8-12)
6. Pray that hard providences would have their due fruit upon unbelievers, bringing them to Christ, and upon believers, being chastised for their sins, to turn to the Lord for new obedience. Pray also that in the Lord's kind providence we would not become complacent, nor trust upon the worldly uncertainty, but might look to the Lord in everything. (Deut. 11.14-17)
7. Pray that the people of God might treasure His Word up in their hearts, that our Scripture memory work, catechetical work, and other memorization of good and holy things would provide a foundation for our thoughts, learning to think the Lord's thoughts after Him, that His Word would be ready on our tongues always. (Deut. 11.18)
8. Pray for parents, that they would take responsibility for their children's education, especially their training in our holy faith, that hearing of Christ from their parents the children of the Church might call upon the Lord early in their lives, that the Lord would spare them from the ravages and wreckage of worldly living. (Deut. 11.18-21)
9. Pray that the Lord would give victory over our spiritual enemies by His mighty power, and that we would use all means to that victory, resisting temptation, saturating our minds with His Word, etc. (Deut. 11.22-25)
10. Pray that the people of God would seek the blessing of the Lord in everything, searching His Word and knowing what do follow in order to that blessing—and pray that we would be found in that way, rather than in the way that leads to destruction and cursing—to love and follow the Lord, and not to follow our own natural and corrupt inclinations. (Deut. 11.26-32)
