Opening Prayer

Wednesday Prayer Meeting, 07/01/2026

Psalm: 114.1-8; Page 339

First Exhortation: Praying Through John's Gospel, Chapter 12: John 12.1-50

Prayer re: Devotion, hypocrisy, opportunity, hardness, kingship, Word, Gentiles, Sacrifice, Following, Deity, Hearing

1. Pray for the professors of Christianity, that true devotion to Christ in all things would accompany that profession, that we would sacrifice our best to Him, that He would receive our first portion and greatest affection and attention. (Jn. 12.1-3)
2. Pray that hypocrites in the Church would be exposed, that they would repent, and trusting Christ, may know the power of His forgiveness, cease accusing others, being critical, producing fruits meet for repentance. (John 12.4-6)
3. Pray that we would seek the Lord while He may be found, and not presume upon His mercy, serving Him while we have opportunity, using the times and seasons He gives us well, testifying to His supreme worth and glory. (John 12.7-8)
4. Pray for the recognition of how hard our hearts are naturally, unto thankfulness and joy over God's mercy. (Jn. 12.10-11)
5. Pray for the reception of Christ as King, in sincerity, with perseverance and strength, that Christ would rule in our hearts here by faith, and would hasten the time of the destruction of Satan's kingdom entirely, bringing in glory. (John 12.12-19)
6. Pray that as we behold fulfilled prophecy in our text, that we would hear the Word of the Lord always with confidence in Him, that He would open our eyes to receive it, that we would not doubt His care, but look for His victory. (John 12.14-16)
7. As the Lord was pleased to draw gentiles to Himself in His day, let us pray for the ingathering of the elect from every tribe and tongue, that the Lord would raise up laborers to the harvest of souls, all to the glory of His Name. (John 12.20-23)
8. Pray that we would remember the costliness of our Lord's sacrifice, as a kernel of wheat falling into the ground, bearing much fruit, so was He pleased to lay down His life for sinners, and with thanksgiving and love to Him join with Him, being "crucified with Christ" and yet ourselves living, that we may live into Him, by the power of His resurrection. (Jn. 12.24-31)
9. Pray that we would follow closely behind our Lord, walking in His light, and shedding that light abroad in this world, walking by faith in Him and His Word, not following the darkness of this world's ways, but testifying against it. (John 12.35-36)
10. Pray for proper reverence to the Lord Jesus Christ as the Lord, high and lifted up, that as Isaiah saw His glory and knew himself to be undone apart from the Lord mercy, so also we would conceive of His glory, and our abasement. (J. 12.37-41)
11. Pray that the Lord's people would hang on His every Word, that His Word would replace an natural and corrupt thinking in our minds, that hearing Him we would not come into judgment, but escape the wrath to come. (John 12.44-50)

Second Exhortation: Praying Through Deuteronomy, Chapter 12: Deuteronomy 12.1-32

Prayer re: Worship; False, Public, Location, & Joyful; Rest, Household, Offering, Blood, Vows, Separation, Imitation

1. Pray for the worship of the Lord, that it would be done according to His commands, in His set times—keeping the Sabbath holy, that we would be diligent each day to worship the Lord as families and individuals, serving the Lord. (Deut. 12.1)
2. Pray concerning false worship, that according to each one's place they would detest and oppose it, removing false worship practices in our spheres of authority, not ensnared by their earthly attraction, worshipping the Lord purely. (Deut. 12.2-4)
3. Pray for the Church, that she would not undervalue the public ordinances of worship, but that Christians would be diligent in their attendance coming with diligence, preparation, and prayer loving the Lord their God, serving Him. (Deut. 12.5-6)
4. Pray that the people of God would be joyful in their King, that serving Him in His worship would be a lightsome thing, undertaken with thankfulness and cheerfulness, being blessed that in Christ He receives them and their service. (Deut. 12.7)
5. Pray that the people of God would understand their rest properly, that we would cease from our own labors for right standing with the Lord, acknowledging that our best works are as filthy rags, and instead rest upon the doing and dying of Christ as our Surety and Substitute, and that each Sabbath day would be a day of gospel rest. (Deut. 12.9-12)
6. Pray for Christian heads of households, that they might lead their families in the things of the Lord, conducting family worship, bringing them to Church, speaking of Christ at all times, ordering their lives around their faith. (Deut. 12.12)
7. Pray that the people of God would not keep themselves aloof from their God, but would offer themselves as living sacrifices, they they would not hold back from the Lord anything of themselves, offering their all to Him. (Deuteronomy 12.13-15)
8. Pray concerning blood, that the shedding of blood would never be unlawfully undertaken, that the Lord would give our society rest from unjust bloodshed, that criminals would be brought to justice, and those who have shed innocent blood would have their blood shed for the cleansing of the land. Pray for deliverance from such violence. (Deut. 12.16, 23-25)
9. Pray concerning the vows we have vowed to the Lord, that we would vow and keep, even if it to our own hurt, that the vows we have made calling upon the Lord to be our Lord would not be broken, that He would give strength. (Deut. 12.17)
10. Pray for the Church, that she would life separated from the world and her ways, that she would be spiritual not carnal, what her members would not love the world, but that by her light the world's darkness might be exposed. (Deut. 12.26-28)
11. Pray that the Church would not imitate the world in her government, delights, economics, concept of family, morality and ethics, nor anything at all, but would follow the example of our God, His Christ, seeking that in His Word. (Deut.12.28-32)
