Opening Prayer

Wednesday Prayer Meeting, 07/15/2026

Psalm: 55.16-23; Page 148

First Exhortation: Praying Through John's Gospel, Chapter 14: John 14.1-31

Prayer re: Peace, Faith, Hope, Way, Godhead, Good Works, Obedience, Communion, Comforter, Satan

1. Pray that the people of God would seek peace with God through Jesus Christ, and that having that communion with Him, would settle their hearts regarding earthly difficulties, casting all their care upon Christ. (John 14.1)
2. Pray for faith in God the Father, faith in Christ, faith in the Spirit, such that we might know that each Person of the Godhead is working on our behalf, that they are the same in substance, equal in power and glory, working salvation for us. (Jn. 14.1-3)
3. Pray for the people of God, and their future estate, that we might have hope and confidence in the work of Christ not only upon earth, but also for His ability now to intercede for us, and prepare an eternal habitation for us, that He will come again, receive us unto Himself, and that we might live in this world in keeping with that glory to come. (John 14.1-3)
4. Pray for our nation, and the Church in it, that we would know the exclusive claims of Christ as Way, Truth, and Life, that there is no path to communion with God but by Him, and that we would follow Him alone. (John 14.4-6)
5. Pray for a proper knowledge of the Godhead, that while Three distinct and divine Persons, they are united by the one Divine Essence, that to have communion with one is to commune with all, that seeing One is seeing all, that we might worship the true God, not an idol, that the Lord would bring down all false notions of who God is. (John 14.7-11)
6. Pray that Christians would always have an eye toward doing works that are good in God's sight, seeking to do good as presented in His Word, and asking Him for direction in that which is good in our places. (John 14.12-14)
7. Pray for an increase of love to Christ in the Church, such that all of His commandments would be embraced by all who profess to know Him, and that they might desire to obey truly Him as an expression of that love. (John 14.15)
8. Pray that our communion with Christ would not be merely emotional, but that we would abide with Him in the truth, in sound doctrine, in godly living, in the means of grace, that these would inform our affection toward Him. (John 14.16-21)
9. Pray concerning the Holy Spirit, that we would know Him as the Comforter, the Teacher, the Rembrancer, and the one who brings the peace of Christ to us, that false notions of the Spirit would flee away from the Church. (John 14.25-27)
10. Pray for the protection of Christ, knowing that the prince of this world had nothing in Him, we are easy marks of His stratagems unless we apply to the Lord for strength, that we might be sober and vigilant against Him. (John 14.30-31)

Psalm: 112.1-5, Page 337

Second Exhortation: Praying Through Deuteronomy, Chapter 14: Deuteronomy 14.1-29

Prayer re: Separation, Temperance, Holiness, Rumination, Tithing, Holy Celebration, Ministry, Generosity, Blessing

1. Pray that in our eating, drinking, labor, mourning, and in all other things, we would live as a people separated out from the world, unto the Lord, holy unto Him, seeking His favor and serving Him in all our works in this world, that we would study to know how our particular calling and duty can be brought to His feet as His people, apart from the world. (Deut. 14.1-21)
2. Pray for temperance, godly self-government, and contentment in all things, that as certain foods were forbidden the ancient people of God, so also we would know those things which are allowable to us, whether food, drink, recreation, leisure, etc. and that which we are to avoid, to maintain a godly testimony before the watching world. (Deuteronomy 14.4-21)
3. Pray that the people of God would pursue holiness—not simple separation from the world, but separation unto a morality that befits their God and Father, with a sincere love for Him and their fellow men, following His commands, giving glory to Him in their living, giving the enemy no occasion of accusation against them. (Deuteronomy 14.21)
4. Pray, as the people of God were commanded only to eat those animals which divided the hoof, that they might be a people divided unto their Lord, and those which chewed the cud, that God's people might ruminate, meditate, and think often and deeply upon God's Word, wringing out the precious truth of it, by the Spirit, for their good. (Deut. 14.6)
5. Pray that the people of God would give to the Lord His due—their tithes and firstfruits, their best, and those offerings above the tithe, confessing that it is the Lord that own all we have, and they as stewards of His mercy. (Deut. 14.22-23)
6. Pray for the Sabbath Day, that the people of God would learn how to rest, enjoy their God, and to celebrate His goodness and mercy to them apart from carnally serving themselves, but in all rejoicing in Him, that each Sabbath would be kept rejoicing in the Gospel rest that it proclaims, looking to Christ and rejoicing in His great salvation. (Deut. 14.24-27)
7. Pray for the gospel ministry, that ministers would be encouraged in their labor, that those who preach the Gospel would live of the Gospel, that those who leave lucrative fields of endeavor to serve the Lord in the ministry would have much by way of encouragement, that they would exercise all diligence. (Deuteronomy 14.27)
8. Pray that the people of God would care for the needy in their bounds with generosity, compassion, and wisdom, that they would not encourage indolence, but provide for those who have, despite godly diligence, met hardship. (Deut. 14.29)
9. Pray that at all times, the Church would seek God's blessing upon His means, that through diligent spiritual exercise, wise administration, and purity in the means of grace, she would seek His blessing, and not the world's. (Deuteronomy 14.29)
